Keep an eye on your speedometer!

France is full of unmarked police cars with mobile speed cameras on board

Buy your fuel off the motorway...

If you want to have some holiday cash left to spend on goodies, look out for large hypermarkets as they've got the cheapest car juice.

✓ Look out for an old-fashioned rule known as priorité à droite...

Which means that you have to give way to cars coming from the right - even if you are on a major road and they are on a minor.

✓ If you're smart you'll get a Liber-t-tag...

Do this before you travel on toll roads. It's linked to your bank account so you can dodge the queues and go straight through the automatic toll lanes.

Don'ts

★ Using the speed camera detector in your sat nav is against the law

You could be slapped with a fine if you're caught using one, so make sure you turn it off!

Kids are not allowed to sit in the front

By law, children under 10 are required to sit in the back - which saves on arguments.

Susing your horn in a built-up area...

It's a serious no-no, except in cases of immediate danger (that doesn't include honking to hurry a cat across the road).

The drink drive limit in France is one of the lowest in Europe (0.05mg/ml)...


So don't be tempted by a cheeky glass of Beaujolais if you're getting behind the wheel.
